"It was easy to see the house was the star of the show, and anything around it should be in keeping with its age," she says. So Marshall patterned her plans on 18<sup>th</sup>-century homesteads, avoiding high-maintenance formal gardens and concentrating on green foundation boxwoods, smoke bushes and viburnum, supplemented by lots of ground-covering pachysandra.

Now, this 18<sup>th</sup>-century jewel is fully decked out with 21<sup>st</sup>-century amenities, a good thing for the perpetual hosts who live here. "We run this place like an inn," Brian says. "On weekends, the rooms are full!" **L**
