Jim Dobson, owner of Dobson Pools, on the New Milford-Washington line, and in business for 33 years, said during a phone interview he works by referrals and deals only with custom granite in-ground pools starting at \$50,000. "When I go to a home I take my portfolio with me and design exclusively for each homeowner, and also discuss the requirements for owning an in-ground pool such as fencing that is required by law. They have the money and it's just the matter of creating the design.

"We also install indoor and outdoor pools with a plastic insert for all season swimming. Today's pools adhere to environmental restrictions and less harmful chemicals are used," said Dobson.
